- CPW needs to approve the expansion of Lake Avery. First to the Director and then the Wildlife Commission.
- Grant funding needs to be obtained
- As currently constructed, the dam is rated as a "High Hazard Dam" due to the houses below the dam. There needs to be an evaluation of the dam rating if the height of the dam is raised.

Forest Management

- Water Storage
- Drought Contingency Planning soil health, crop selection

Next Steps:
